Activity Bookings and Cancellations

Due to our intimate size, all cancellations and revisions to established itineraries affect us significantly. Consequently, we adhere to a strict cancellation policy.

- In order to best accommodate all of our guests, our activities are offered on a set schedule. Please contact the Concierge, a Wilderness Outpost representative or the in-room Compendium for times.
- We recommend booking your activities with as much advanced notice as possible. Most activities require at least 24-hours advanced booking. Fly-fishing requires 48-hours. Fly-fishing and other popular activities book up quickly and we cannot guarantee availability.
- All cancellations require 24-hour advance notice before the activity start time. Changes made to activity reservations within 24-hours, outside of full cancellations, may result in service charges.
- All cancellations made in less than 24-hours, including “no shows,” will be charged full price of the activity. Cancellations within 24-hours, due to extreme weather conditions, will not be charged.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before the scheduled starting time.
- All activities leave no later than 10 minutes after the scheduled starting time.
- Private tours may be available for a 50 percent surcharge.
- A Resort Fee of 18% will be applied to all activity fees. Guests are not required to tip for the duration of their stay.

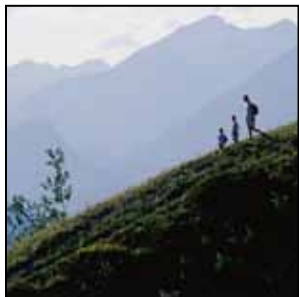

Our naturalist guides will enlighten you with information about native plants and wildlife, the history of the Blackfoot Valley and more. Learn how the Anaconda Copper Mining Company affected the town of Sunset; about the celebrated history of the Blackfoot River, and of course, the legendary tales of Lewis and Clark and their place in Montana history. This educational hiking experience will last an estimated two hours, but you'll remember it for a lifetime.

LESSONS

For those looking to sharpen their skills or pick up a few pointers, private lessons are available for ages 6 and older, including riding, western trail, roping and basic horsemanship.

T.C.R. Trust, communication, and respect, we will teach you how to obtain these with your horse while here at Paws Up.

Our lesson programs are by the hour, and can start at one-day to multiple day packages. They run the gamut from basic horsemanship to advanced, through all disciplines. Whether your background is in English or Western and want to advance your horsemanship skills to another level, you never have been exposed to a horse before, your first experience with a horse was a negative one, our program can accommodate. By stressing safety first, we feel the first step in horsemanship is truly understanding how a horse lives. As soon as you step foot in our 22,000 square foot heated arena, you are told to “forget about being a human being and become a horse”. But don’t worry, we promise we won’t feed you hay at dinner.

CHUCK WAGON DINNERS WITH WAGON RIDE

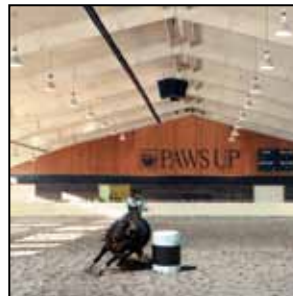

There’s almost nothing in life that rivals the feeling of a hefty trout striking your fly, and the ensuing fight, headshakes and all. With that in mind, we’d like to welcome you to a slice of fly-fishing heaven. The Resort at

Paws Up is an angler’s retreat that’s located within the golden triangle of western trout fishing. It boasts a creel-full of legendary rivers on property or nearby—including the Blackfoot, Bitterroot, Missouri and Clark Fork. So whether you’re checking off a few more Montana rivers, or are ready to pioneer into some true trout wilderness, this is the place for you.

FOR THE EXPERIENCED ANGLER



“In Montana fly fishing is much more than a sport, it is a religion,” if you are one of the chosen few who appreciate those immortal words of Norman Maclean then the Resort at Paws Up is for you. Like the weather

in the Rockies, the fishing changes drastically by the season; seasoned anglers know to choose spring and fall for the smorgasbord of flies, fish, and Montana sky.

The spring fishing in Western Montana is a little known and highly guarded secret. Fishing starts in mid-March and runs through mid May with the emergence of the much anticipated skwala stone fly. These large (size 10) bugs make fish pay attention. Mixing with the skwalas are march browns and grey drakes. Early spring fishing is a chance for both angler and fish alike to get the kinks worked out after a long lethargic winter.

Late spring fishing reveals the king-of-spring or the Salmon fly. If the skwala was a T-Bone than the salmon fly is the entire steer. These huge (size 4) floating orange monsters resemble more prehistoric beast than delicate trout fare. Local anglers wildly chase this hatch up the drainage and right past our doorstep; out-of-state anglers lucky enough to hit this hatch once, frequently make a spring pilgrimage to Montana in hopes of another chance.

If the spring fishing represents wild abandon, the fall is a classical symphony set to the immortal percussive beat of a Montana river and sky. By mid-September, the high water temperatures return to bone chilling normal and the intense insect activity

resumes. This is the time of the year trout, bugs and anglers alike realize the band is on its last set and we must get out and dance. Fish feed with reckless abandon on Mahogany duns, blue winged olives and the prince of fall, the October caddis, as they look ahead to shorter days and a long winter.

Again Norman Maclean had it right “all existence fades to a being with my soul and memories and the sounds of the Big Blackfoot River and a four-count rhythm and the hope that a fish will rise.” Fish Montana in the spring and fall and you will then realize why locals and seasoned anglers celebrate this as their their “Montana time.”

THREE RIVERS IN THREE DAYS



Welcome to fly-fishing Nirvana. Centrally located in the middle of hundreds of miles of fishable water, Paws Up is the ideal destination for the serious fisherman. Even the most avid anglers are known to weep openly at

the prospect of the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to fish three spectacular rivers in three days...all under one glorious Big Sky. Depending on what rivers are fishing the best, spend your three days fishing the hallowed Northwestern waters of the Blackfoot, Clark Fork, Bitterroot or Missouri.

The Blackfoot

The Blackfoot River was immortalized in Norman Maclean’s book A River Runs Through It, which later became a successful film by the same name. Seven miles of the famous “Big” Blackfoot River run right through the heart of Paws Up Ranch. If you could imagine the perfect western freestone trout stream,

the Blackfoot would be it. The beauty and scenery are unmatched by any river in Montana, with deep emerald pools followed by fast boulder-strewn pocket water, which flows into bubbling choppy riffles and waist

deep clear runs. Trout inhabit practically every inch of this river – primarily cutthroat and rainbow with a good population of monster brown trout – as well. Because of the proximity to the Resort, the Blackfoot is considered our ‘home water’ and our guides know every rock, run, and riffle. In other words, the most productive, secret fishing holes will not be kept secret from you. The dry-fly fishing on the Blackfoot has been described as both forgiving and phenomenal.

The Clark Fork



The Clark Fork has been called “the best river in the west that no one knows about” and “the under-utilized jewel of Western Montana”. This classic dry-fly river holds hard-fighting rainbows and features long riffles,

runs and very few pools. Because of the significant size of this high producing river, most fishing is done from a drift boat and wading opportunities are scarce. Every fly-fishermen should experience two things in his/her angling experience: casting under the Big Sky and fighting a rainbow out of the Clark Fork.

The Bitterroot

Located just 90-minutes from Paws Up, the Bitterroot River is named for the pink flower that grows on the hills surrounding the valley. To modern day anglers, the Bitterroot means something else: western dry-fly fishing at its finest. This classic western free-



stone river is known for its stonefly and mayfly hatches. The famous mid-March skwalla hatch brings plenty of huge west slope cutthroat to the surface. Characterized by deep swirling logjam pools,

quick turbulent riffles and fish-filled mid-stream buckets, the Bitterroot offers anglers an experience to be savored, saved, and shared with future generations of anglers forever.

The Missouri



Looking for a challenging and rewarding opportunity for successful fly-fishing? The blue-ribbon Missouri river, just 90-minutes from The Resort at Paws Up, provides the angler with some of the best fishing

in the west. The legendary blanket hatches of mayflies and caddis make every fish in the Missouri look to the surface. Known as primarily a rainbow fishery, this gentle-sloped tail water fishery has been seeing an increasing number of browns in the past few years. No fly-fishing career is complete until you spend a day on Montana’s historic “Big Mo.”

CATCH AND RELEASE



We believe that our fishing resources, like all our natural resources, are too valuable to be wasted; therefore we practice catch-and-release on all of our outfitted fishing trips. This catch-and-release philosophy suggests that angling is valued as a high-quality recre-

ational experience. With today's fishing pressure, it has become more important than ever to make a commitment to the future by limiting our harvest and preserving our water resources. Where fish mortality must be kept low to sustain and recover fish populations, the release of fish is an important tool to allow anglers to sport fish, yet minimize the impact on fish populations. By releasing fish, anglers allow a single fish to be "recycled" to provide recreation for others. Catch-and-release fishing results in greater numbers of larger fish. Only in this way will future generations be able to experience the enjoyment of quality angling found along our many streams and rivers. Without these regulations, the preservation of these fisheries could be damaged beyond repair.

Shooting Sports



Sporting Clays is a challenging, wildly fun, and competitive clay target game that simulates actual field hunting. Shoot on specially designed courses that resemble real-life field conditions; the lure of

the game lies in its incredible realism. At Paws Up, our Sporting Clays installation features a 12-station course that throws a diversity of aerial target presentations. The clays cross, climb, zip in, fly out, or streak high overhead at speeds and angles accurately simulating the flight patterns of game birds. The course is divided into stations that are identifiable by the game they are designed to imitate, such as Quail Flushing into Woodland, Rabbit Bouncing for Cover, Ducks Landing in a Swamp, or Doves Whistling High Overhead. Sporting Clays is indeed a game that puts a shot gunner's abilities to the ultimate test. For beginners and experts alike, you are bound to have a blast. During certain times of year, sporting clays may encompass only the 5-stand and not the full course.

River Adventures

"A RIVER RUNS THROUGH IT"



Lewis and Clark put the Blackfoot River on the map. Norman Maclean put it into print. Redford and Pitt put it on the big screen. Now it's your turn to pay homage to this majestic river in your own way. During this

float trip down the Blackfoot, you can photograph it, feel its power, soak up its beauty, and remember it for life. You'll see rainbow trout in a feeding frenzy and whitetail deer watering at the banks. You'll bask in the warm Montana sun, stretch out under the Big Sky, and cool off in the shadows of towering rock canyons and cliffs. Along the way, you'll see incredible sights and your guide will share fascinating river lore. After a two-and-one-half-hour float downstream, you will pull into a riverbank picnic area where an hors d'oeuvres reception awaits. You'll be treated to cold beverages, picnic tables, gourmet refreshments and a great swimming area.

THE "BIG" BLACKFOOT KAYAK TOUR

Our own Blackfoot River has a storied history. Fur trappers once worked the river – while avoiding encounters with the Blackfeet Indians. Later, timber companies used the river to float logs downstream to the sawmill at Bonner (a charming town on the way to Paws Up). Now it's your turn

to take on the Blackfoot on an exhilarating, inflatable kayak adventure. The Blackfoot is one of Montana's top whitewater streams (particularly during the high-water months of early summer), lined with spectacular

rock outcroppings and dramatic short canyons. Your expert guide will lead you around rocks, boulders, rapids, pools and other obstacles for a thrilling downstream adventure. Gourmet hors d'oeuvres will await you as you arrive at Paws Up's picture-perfect sandbar picnic area.

**ALBERTON GORGE
 WHITEWATER EXPERIENCE**



The Alberton Gorge was formed 15,000 years ago when 30 miles of ice impounded Glacial Lake Missoula. When the water breached the ice dam, the ensuing floods formed the spectacular rock formations you see

today. Running through this gorge is the canyon section of the Clark Fork River. The Clark Fork is a large river with high-volume rapids (Class III and IV). This premier rafting run is highlighted by the finest, most reliable whitewater in the state of Montana, views of the Alberton Gorge's magnificent

rock formations and dramatic rose-colored cliffs. In addition to the exhilaration of shooting whitewater amidst spectacular scenery, you will likely see many different types of birds including osprey, mergansers, eagles, kingfishers and hawks. Deer, bear, moose and elk are also known to make frequent riverbank appearances. If we haven't convinced you to take this all-day guided whitewater experience yet, maybe William Clark will.

LEVEL ONE KAYAKING CLASS



Ponds and lakes are a great introduction to the sport of whitewater kayaking. Ponds and lakes are a safe and fun learning environment where you will be taught the basic fundamentals of whitewater kayaking. All

beginner kayak classes take place at Blanchard Lake on the Clearwater River. In class, you will learn how to outfit your kayak, get out of your boat ("wet-exits"), boat control, braces (to keep your boat upright!) and basic strokes such as the forward and reverse sweeps, correction strokes, and combination strokes. You will also learn some basic rescue exercises such as the "T-rescue" and "open-water rescue". All of these exercises and techniques are essential building blocks in learning how to roll your kayak and floating the river.

LEVEL TWO KAYAKING CLASS



If you realized that you had so much fun in your first class and are yearning for more this is the class for you! In this class, you will head to the river to learn fundamental river running techniques of whitewater kayaking-eddy turns, peel out, and ferries. You will also learn more advance strokes like the c-stroke, sculling braces and draws, more combination strokes, edge control, and rolling your kayak. We will also focus on river safety and awareness skills- river hazards and obstacles, scouting rapids, self-rescue and general river knowledge. Level Two classes usually take place on the Blackfoot River

CLEARWATER CANOE CRUISE

How did the Clearwater River get its name? In May and June, while other Montana rivers are



churning brown with run-off, the Clearwater filters through a chain of lakes including Rainy, Alva, Inez, Seeley, and Salmon. This leaves the water crystal clear, and provides a spectacular site for Paws Up's

own wildlife-themed, canoe tour. You'll follow the beautifully shaded meanderings of the Clearwater through dense deciduous and pine forests and sun-drenched grassy marshlands. After your float, return to civilization via a short, scenic hike past a bird blind where birds such as bald eagles, osprey, great blue herons, mergansers, loons, kingfishers and red-tailed hawks will be your cast for this unforgettable performance by Mother Nature.

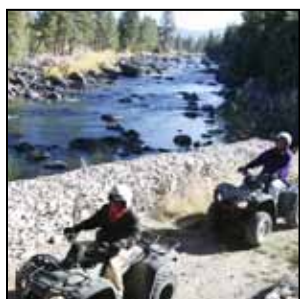

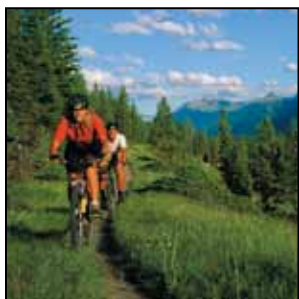
